Charleston First Responders Attend American Sign Language Training

CHARLESTON, WV (WCHS/ WVAH) — Charleston first responders recently attended a special training course to learn how to communicate with more than just their voices.

"It's just beneficial," Charleston Police Chief Opie Smith said. "I think when you can learn to communicate with folks that may have a disability, it just makes you a better police department."

BridgeValley Community and Technical College is helping to break down the communication barrier. On Tuesday, it gave an American Sign Language training course to police and other first responders. The goal was to teach them a way to communicate when it matters most, like during an emergency or a natural disaster.

"We have found a trainer for the Charleston police first responders so that they can learn ASL which is a very awesome thing to provide for the community because it allows for a safer environment for everyone," BridgeValley Dean Kristi Ellenberg said.

Police Chief Smith called the sign language class long overdue.

"I think it is good as a law enforcement agency, I think it makes you more well rounded. You know you train with weapons, driving, defensive tactics, why not train for folks that are hard of hearing, maybe even PTSD things like that," he said.

The first responders said the training course will help them provide better and faster emergency care to the deaf population. "Information for the police is very important and the quicker they can ascertain a situation, the better and this will enable them to do that for a very special population of people," Ellenberg said.

The emergency responders are planning more training opportunities in sign language in the future. For more information on the project, see http:// www.wvdhhr.org/wvcdhh/.




Welcome to Our Summer Newsletter!







CHIPOTLE-MAPLE CHICKEN THIGHS


(Serves 6-8; Total Time: 1 hour)

This is juicy, spicy, glorious barbecued chicken. They cook fast, like chicken breasts, but they have richer flavor and don't dry out. The rub and the sauce add great layers of flavor and it's bright and spicy and wonderful. This recipe would work fine with chicken breasts, chicken tenders, or pork tenderloin.

1 Tablespoon smoked paparika 1 Tablespoon packed dark brown sugar 1-1/2 teaspoons kosher salt 2 teaspoons dry mustard, divided 1-1/2 teaspoons garlic powder, divided 1/2 teaspoon chili powder 1/4 teaspoon freshly grounded black pepper 2-1/2 lbs skinless, boneless chicken thighs 1/2 cup ketchup 1/4 cup pure maple syrup

- 2 Tablespoons molasses1 Tablespoon finely chopped chipotle
- chile peppers in adobo sauce
- 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder3 Tablespoons freshly squeezed lime juice





- 1. In a small bowl, combine smoked paprika, brown sugar, salt, 1 teaspoon dry mustard, 1 teaspoon garlic powder, chili powder, and black pepper. Sprinkle and pat mixture evenly on both sides of chicken thighs. Chill, covered, for 30 minutes.
- 2. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, combine ketchup, maple syrup, molasses, chipotle peppers, Worcestershire sauce, and the remaining 1 teaspoon dry mustard and 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder. Bring just to boiling; reduce heat to low and simmer uncovered for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Set aside.
- 3. Prepare a gas or charcoal grill for direct cooking over medium-high heat. Arrange chicken on a lightly oiled grill rack, cover grill, and cook 4 minutes. Flip and cook 4 minutes more. Stir lime juice into sauce. Brush chicken with some of the sauce, flip and cook 1 minute. Brush sauce on the second side, flip and cook 1 minute more, or until done (170 °F). Remove from grill; let rest 5 minutes. Serve with lime wedges for squeezing, if desired.



GRILLED SWEET POTATO WEDGES WITH DIPPING SAUCES

(Serves 8; Prep Time: 30 minutes; Grill: 8-10 minutes)

- 6 medium sweet potatoes or russet potatoes (about 2 pounds) 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1 teaspoon kosher or sea salt or 3/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper Honey sesame sauce (recipe below) Creamy chive sauce (recipe below)

- 1. Scrub potatoes with a soft vegetable brush under running water. Cut each unpeeled potato in half lengthwise, then cut each half lengthwise into 4 wedges. In a covered 4-quart Dutch oven, cook potato wedges in boiling, lightly salted water for 8 minutes or until just tender. Drain and cool slightly. Place potatoes in a large bowl; drizzle with oil and sprinkle with salt and black pepper. Toss gently to coat.
- 2. For a charcoal or gas grill, grill potato wedges on the greased rack of an covered grill directly over medium heat for 8 to 10 minutes or until edges begin to brown, turning occasionally.
- 3. Transfer potatoes to a serving dish; serve with honey sesame sauce and/or creamy chive sauce. Serve immediately or at room temperature. Makes 8 servings.

<u>Creamy Chive Sauce</u>: 1/2 cup sour cream or plain yogurt; 1/2 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing; 2 Tablespoons snipped fresh chives; 3 Tablespoons finely shredded Asiago cheese; 2 Tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese or 1 Tablespoon crumbled blue cheese. In a small bowl, stir together sour cream, mayonnaise, and chives. Stir in Asiago cheese and Parmesan cheese.

<u>Honey Sesame Sauce</u>: 1/4 cup reduced sodium soy sauce; 1/4 cup rice vinegar, sake, or white wine vinegar; 3 Tablespoons honey; 2 Tablespoons finely chopped green onions; 2 Tablespoons toasted sesame seeds; 1 Tablespoon toasted sesame oil. In a small bowl, combine soy sauce, rice vinegar, honey, green onions, toasted sesame seeds, and toasted sesame oil. Stir until honey dissolves. Makes about 3/4 cup.
